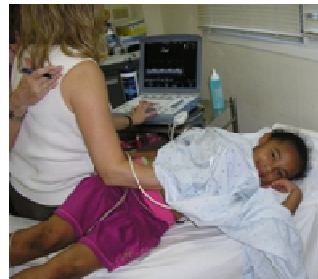
Projects



The Rotary Club of Omaha continues to be a vital part of the fabric of the Omaha community. We've been getting things done for almost 100 years!

- Chartered Council Bluffs Rotary in 1915 and West Omaha in 1955.
- Established the Boy Scouts in Omaha.
- Established Easter Seal Society in Omaha.
- Established **J.P. Lord School**, our Adopt-A-School Partner.
- In 1927, Established the **Honor Roll** program that recognizes 8th grade students for outstanding achievement.
- Awards **scholarships** to senior Honor Roll students.
- Provides financial support to the Salvation Army through donations, and Bell Ringing.

- Serves as a host to one of the participating teams in the **NCAA College World Series**.
- Funded drive for the Henry Doorly Zoo's "Garden of the Senses."

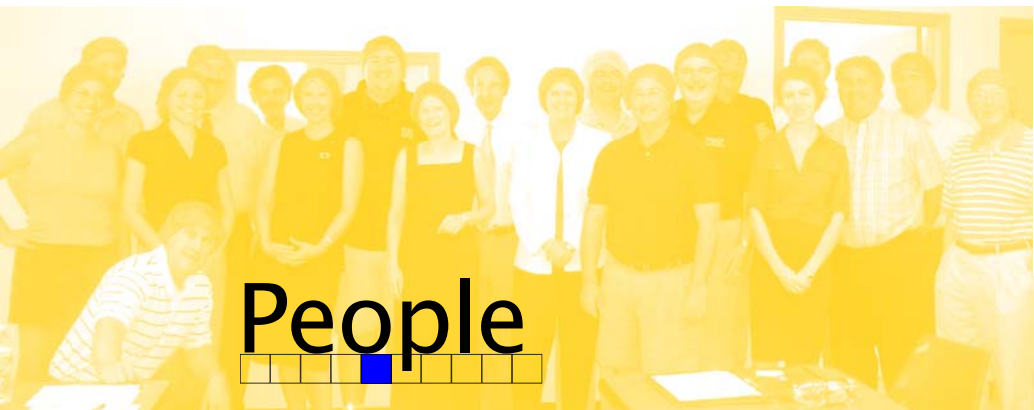
Part of the enjoyment of Rotary is the fellowship and business networking at the weekly meetings.

What is the Financial Commitment?

There is a one-time entrance fee of \$250 and annual dues of \$300. Our Rotary year begins July 1 and ends June 30. .

In addition, each member of the Rotary Club of Omaha is encouraged to make an annual contribution to the Service Fund. This fund was established to cover community service projects. The fund works off a separate budget from the General Operations of the club. The average commitment made each year is \$100.

Additional donations to The Omaha Downtown Rotary Club Foundation and Rotary International's Foundation are also encouraged.
